In 2002 Barnaby Palmer was named Artistic Director of San Francisco Lyric Opera and has since conducted over 20 new productions with that organization. He has served as guest conductor for Opera San Jose and Livermore Opera. In April 2008 Barnaby will be Music Director for Opera San Jose's production of Mozart's Die Zauberflote. He has studied conducting with Alan Gilbert, Rossen Milanov, Larry Rachleff and most recently Michael Morgan.
