## BIOGRAPHY

In demand as a conductor, and guest lecturer, Andrzej Dzikowski is the is the Director of Music and Conductor at St. Leo the Great Church in Inwood, WV and Artistic Director and Conductor of the Langley Wind Symphony. In addition he is the Associate Conductor of the Langley Symphony Orchestra. With over 35 years of experience as a performing pianist and 22 years as a conductor and educator, Mr. Dzikowski most recently held the position of Supervisor of Music for the Angleton Independent School District in Angleton, Texas. Throughout his career, Mr. Dzikowski has been recognized by colleagues, students, national organizations and leading professionals alike. Making his Carnegie Hall conducting debut in 2003, Mr. Dzikowski has conducted performances in many major venues in the US and Europe including The Stephansdom in Vienna, Clowes Hall, Haydn Hall at the Esterhazy Palace, Kremmunster Abbey, Atlanta Symphony Hall and Melk Abbey to name a few. He will return to Carnegie Hall in April 2007 to conduct two world premieres with the Langley Wind Symphony. Just recently Mr. Dzikowski returned from a very successful concert tour of Austria in the summer of 2006. Mr. Dzikowski has been a guest on National Public Radio's "Desert Island Disks", published in School Band and Orchestra Magazine, been recognized with national awards including the N.B.A. Citation of Excellence, and has produced many educational and professional concerts including performances by the Hartt Symphony Orchestra, Wynton Marsalis and the Lincoln Center Jazz Orchestra, the University of Michigan Symphony Band, Dennis DiBlasio Quartet, Chris Vadala Quartet and the Hartt Wind Symphony. Mr. Dzikowski has conducted ensembles at national, regional and state level music conferences as well as throughout the country. An advocate of education and music of our time, Mr. Dzikowski is responsible for four recent new music commissions from composers Richard Danielpour, Arturo Rodriguez, Christopher Marshall, and Steven Bryant.

A Pennsylvania native, Mr. Dzikowski is the founder and former Music Director of the Lehigh Valley Youth Wind Orchestra, and former Assistant Conductor of the Sparta Symphony Orchestra in New Jersey. He has also served as the Resident Conductor/Music Director for Campus Music Festivals and as a guest clinician and conductor for music festivals throughout the United States and Canada.

Mr. Dzikowski graduated from Susquehanna University and continued his studies at the Juilliard School of Music, the Hartt School of Music, Butler University, Duquesne University, Shenandoah Conservatory and Boston University.

Mr. Dzikowski has studied throughout the country with a wide range of conductors including: Stanley DeRusha, Orchestra Conductor of the Direccion Orquestal, resident conductor Indianapolis Chamber Orchestra, former conductor of the Bogata Symphony Orchestra in South America; Vincent LaSelva, Music Director of the New York City Grand Opera; H. Robert Reynolds, Professor of Conducting at the University of Michigan (ret), Principal Conductor of the Wind Ensemble Thornton School of Music at the University of Southern California; Craig Kirchoff, Professor of Conducting at the University of Minnesota; Robert Cameron, Professor of Conducting and Ensembles at Duquesne University; and Allan McMurray, Professor of Conducting at the University of Colorado at Boulder.
