## Biography

With her playing described as “sensational”, British pianist Nicola Meecham has been gaining international acclaim from critics and listeners alike since the release of her recent CD on the SOMM label.

Nicola started playing the piano at the age of four and gave her concerto debut at the age of thirteen. She went on to study at the Royal Academy of Music where she won numerous competitive prizes, including the Academy’s highest distinction, the Macfarren Gold Medal. Study awards included scholarships from the Countess of Munster Musical Trust and from the Czech Government to study in Prague and she was a prizewinner of the Goddard Concert Trust. Her teachers have included Hilary Coates, Hamish Milne and Andrzej Esterhazy.

Since her debut for the Park Lane Group 20th Century Music Series in London, Nicola has performed in all the major halls, including Wigmore Hall, St John’s Smith Square, the Queen Elizabeth Hall and Purcell Room, and at prestigious international festivals including Exeter and King’s Lynn. Abroad, she has performed in Holland, Italy, Belgium and the Czech Republic.

Nicola has given premières of works by a number of international composers for which she has received critical acclaim. These include Henryk Górecki’s Four Preludes Op 1, HK Gruber’s Luftschlösser and David Horne’s Nocturnes and Nightmares.

Her recording output includes a highly acclaimed disc for the SOMM label featuring solo piano music by Janáček, Kodály and Enescu. She has also recorded music by Kurt Schwertsik and the maverick American composer ‘Moondog’ (aka Louis Hardin) for the Kopf and Largo labels. In addition, Nicola has broadcast recitals for BBC Radio 3 and for Dutch Radio and has appeared on BBC 2.

Nicola’s concerto and recital repertoire is wide-ranging and includes many rarely performed works. She has a great affection for folk- inspired music, particularly from Central and Eastern Europe, and her recitals have also featured music by Latin and South American composers.
